MASONIC EDUCATION Larry Laidlaw, P.M., H.A.



Brethren,

This excerpt from the Grand Lodge proceeding pre-dates the current amalgamation of San Francisco #120 but I hope to find a connection through the various lodges of which we are composed.

May 10, 1859

In consequence of a want of Harmony among the members of San Francisco Lodge, No.7,

It became my painful duty to order the arrest of the charter of that Lodge on the eighteenth day of March last. (1859)

From the representations made to me by all of its officers and a large portion of its members, I am satisfied that any further effort to restore peace and harmony among those composing that body will prove entirely un-availing; yet 1 earnestly recommend a thorough investigation into the causes producing the unhappy estrangement which has there existed for a period of nearly three year, and which is calculated to produce consequences most detrimental to the best of the interest of the Craft in that portion of our jurisdiction; and invite such action as may perhaps remedy like evils in the future. **N. Greene Curtis, Grand Master**

May 10, 1859

By an order of the Grand Master, dated the eighteenth day of March 1859, the charter of San Francisco Lodge No. 7, was arrested and that instrument, together with its seal and books, have been taken charge of by the undersigned, and are now submitted. The funds of the Lodge, amounting to nearly \$700, have been left in the hands of its treasurer, being deemed perfectly secure; and it has not been considered expedient to remove its jewels, and other valuable property from the hall where they are kept, until final action in regard to the return or revocation of its charter shall have been had by the Grand Lodge. A list of the names of all those who upon the books of each of the Lodges above named, are delinquent for dues, is herewith presented.


